# Willer shares history of Brunsville at Genealogical Society gathering

A gathering of 40-plus who attended the regular meeting of the Northwest Iowa Genealogical Society on August 17 was treated to a presentation on the history of Brunsville by Susan Willer.

The presentation centered on how the town's history has influenced its present-day culture and the community. It included facts about the jail, businesses, schools and even information on Brunsville's own newspaper.

Among the more interesting topics was the fire that destroyed the north side of downtown Brunsville. Before he passed away, the late Gene Dickman was able to provide first-hand information about the fire, since he was a youngster when it took place.

Dickman and his longtime friend, the late Alvin Willer (Susan's uncle), were valuable sources of information for the project. Willer, who grew up on a farm outside of Brunsville, spent hours doing research and those on hand at the Plymouth County Museum were also asked to interact with their own stories about Brunsville.

Photos of the town's softball teams, businesses, schools and even a complete road map with photos of residents by their homes from 1976 were available for viewing after the program.

# Recipe of the month: Caramel Oatmeal Bars

1 c. flour 1/2 tsp. baking soda

1 c. oatmeal 1/4 tsp. salt 3/4 c. brown sugar 3/4 c. melted butter

Mix well to form crumbs. Press half into a 9-inch square pan. Bake 10 minutes at 350°.

#### Spread with:

3/4 c. caramel ice cream topping

1 (6 oz.) pkg. chocolate chips

1/2 c. chopped pecans

3 T. flour

Top with remaining crumb mixture. Bake until brown, approximately 15 minutes. Chill 1 to 2 hours. Cut into 24 bars.

#### **Food facts**

#### Take a moment for mayonnaise

Mayonnaise must contain at least 65 percent oil by weight; any less and it must be called salad dressing. Most fat-free mayonnaise contains more sodium than full-fat mayonnaise. A tablespoon of mayonnaise contains only 5 to 10 milligrams of cholesterol, because very little egg yolk is used.

#### Don't fool with foil

Never wrap acidic fruits such as lemons, oranges, tomatoes and grapefruits in aluminum foil. A chemical reaction may take place that will corrode the foil. A common method of preparing meat loaf is to place tomato sauce on top while the meat is cooking and then cover it with foil, but tomato sauce or paste can eat right through the foil.

#### The shake on shakes

Most thick shakes contain so many additives that are derived from sodium that one serving can contain more sodium than an order of French fries.

#### Baked is better

Some seafood chains offer baked fish, which provides about 200 calories less than fried fish; it also clocks in with about one-half as much sodium.
