Molting is a natural process that occurs annually in chickens, when they shed their old feathers and grow new ones. Chickens typically molt in late summer and early fall, and the process can last 4 to 12 weeks. Chickens molt to replace their feathers for the winter months, and to focus their energy on feather regrowth instead of laying eggs.
