

## Recipe of the month: Sweet and Sour Chicken

1 (8 oz.) btl. Russian salad dressing 1 (2 1/2 to 3 lb.) chicken 1 env. dry onion soup mix 1 (10 oz.) jar apricot preserves

Cooked rice

Combine salad dressing, onion mix and apricot preserves. Place chicken, cut in serving pieces, in shallow baking dish. Pour mixture over chicken. Put in oven and baste occasionally with pan drippings. Bake at 350° for 1 1/2 hours. Serve hot with rice.
