Meet The Women of The Corner...Cafe

On Tuesday, July 17, four amazing women gathered to talk about what it's like to own and run the Corner Café.

Kathy Renken, along with her husband, Don, ran the Corner for 20 years. Her first day was August 1, 1979 and her last day was August 1, 1999. She says she had lots of favorite customers because she was so gullible. "People would get under my skin." Gordy Linstrand, for instance. And she loved James Willer. "Al Willer always gave me a hard time-still does." She loves the remodeling and the owners. "We're so lucky to have a place to go. I wish locals would realize that. We especially noticed it when it was closed (for a while)." Sometimes she wishes she'd kept the Corner a little longer, "but I enjoy life more not having it," she smiles.

Doris Taylor owned the Corner from 1999 until 2004. She started by working for Kathy. After two weeks Doris asked her, "You ever think about selling this place?" Kathy thought about it over the weekend and they worked out a deal soon afterward. Why did Doris choose to run the Corner? "I took it as a challenge," she beams. Plus she hated working her previous job. Doris was famous for recruiting customers to play Town Feud (aka Family Feud) and was one of the first of the smaller bars to hold karaoke. She had mixed feelings about selling the Corner. "I hated leaving friends but I'd already bought a house in Texas."

Candy Harms Lambert is the daughter of the late Polly Harms, who owned the Corner 2004 until 2006. "Mom loved it here," Candy recalls. Polly served breakfast, had daily specials, and held poker runs. "She had to have it open at 6am," Candy says. Polly always sat at the large round table. She wouldn't let anyone sit there except the card players. "Mom had always wanted to own the Corner. She cooked for many different places: Plymouth County Home, Archie's Waeside...She made everything from scratch."

Cheri Schumacher was the next owner but she was not able to be at the Corner July 17. Much of the interior remodeling was completed when she ran the business. Andrea Raasch started at the Corner on Oct. 7, 2010. She runs the Corner with her husband, Dave. "It's getting busier, we're getting more of a steady crowd and they're getting used to us being open. The people are very nice. I'm very glad they want to come back," Andrea says. "We hope to be here many more years. It's been a challenge but it's going good."

Renken, a junior, had an 18-8 pitching record with a 1.78 ERA, striking out 176 batters.

The Bulldogs reached a regional final, losing a 2-1 battle to Sioux City Bishop Heelan. Le Mars finished in a three-way tie for the Lakes Conference title with Emmetsburg and Estherville-Lincoln Central, each posting 11-3 league marks.

Sophomore Colan Borchers had a stellar season on the mound for the Le Mars High School baseball team. Borchers finished with a 6-3 record and 56 strikeouts.

The Bulldogs won their second straight Lakes Conference championship and came within a game of the state tournament, losing to Sioux City Bishop Heelan in a substate final at Lewis and Clark Park.

The winning team with the lowest tournament score of 63 included Clark Schmitz, Mick and Shane Muth and Craig Oetken, according to Geddes.

There was support for the fundraiser from businesses.

"We had hole sponsors and would like to thank businesses from the surrounding areas for being sponsors and providing door prizes," she said.

Plans will be made for a second "Chipping Away At Cancer" tournament next summer, Geddes said.

From War to Wedded Bliss: Ottie Kleihauer Offers Glimpse into His Life

Serving His Country

When he was 20 years old, Ottie Kleihauer served as corporal in World War II, traveling to Germany, Belgium and France. And he is not without a story or two.

While at sea, Kleihauer ran into his brother-in-law, who was serving in the Navy. The two were on separate ships but the ships were stopped so that the two could converse.

Kleihauer was able to lead a man to Christianity. As German buzz bombs exploded nearby, a fellow soldier cried out, "How can I be saved?" Kleihauer responded, "Turn to God." The soldier declared, "If God will save me, I will be a good church worker after this." God did spare him and he kept his promise.

Once the war was over in '45, Kleihauer felt like he had changed. He also didn't have a car. He had a tough time locating one because tires were rationed.

Finding Love

Fast forward to 1990. While at a dance at the Brunsville Legion, Ray and the late Dorothy Lubben introduced Kleihauer to a woman named Jeannine. He asked her to dance.

"He was a good dancer," Jeannine remembers. "He taught me a lot about dancing."

The two got more acquainted on a Good Neighbors Club cruise and on December 13, 1991, they were married. Jeannine had to move to the farm because Kleihauer was not done farming. Then approximately nine years ago, the couple moved to Brunsville.

Greetings Brunsville, Time for an Update from AFGNMARK:

In Afghanistan, we are going through a period called Ramazan which is spelled 'Ramadan' in other Islamic countries. This is a time for a cleansing of body and soul by not eating or drinking when the sun is up. The dates for Ramazan run from 20 July to 18 August.

People who have made it through the day begin their night eating by breaking their fast by eating dates and then into their meal. In the morning, people have to get up, eat and drink before the sun comes up.

At the end of Ramazan, there is a festival called Eid al-Fitr. This follows Ramazan with the first full moon after August 18. The Afghans describe Eid al-Fitr as Christmas. For three days people can eat drink and exchange gifts.

Although Ramazan is the biggest religious holiday in the area, the fighting has not slowed down a bit. Every Sunday morning I go to the front of ISAF Headquarters for the weekly honoring of those who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country. Lately we have been averaging 11 American families getting the worst news they can imagine. For the last two weeks, one of the casualties was a woman.

At this time we have had 5,026 insurgents leave the battlefield opting for peace and the future of Afghanistan. Afghanistan has the opportunity to be a lot of things, but one thing it will never be is Brunsville.
