Vernon Harrington and his brother, Loren, rode the train from Brunsville to Merrill with their grandma Annie Siebens.

Al Willer never rode the train but recalls Albert Osterbuhr retrieving mail from the train for post mistress Dolly Richards. The train would leave Sioux City, stop in numerous towns along the way including James, Hinton, Merrill, Brunsville, and other towns along the way up to nearby Huron, SD. It would then come back the same day. "If you had a relative in the

The passenger train came through Brunsville at 1 p.m. and 4 p.m. He doesn't recall how much it cost to ride the train but he did receive a quarter for a basket of cobs that post mistress Richards would take into her garage behind the office. The train didn't have many passengers except during World War II when it was loaded with army soldiers. One day Gene found an army cap along the tracks. He was pretty excited about his find.

### Recipe of the Month: Pecan Turtle Cake

Prepare a German chocolate cake mix according to package directions. Bake 1/2 the batter in a greased 9x13 pan for 15 min. Melt together 3/4 c. margarine, 1/2 c. evaporated milk & 14 oz. bag caramels while the cake is baking. Pour over hot cake & sprinkle with 1 c. chocolate chips & 1 c. pecan pieces. Pour the rest of the cake batter over the above & bake another 15-20 min.

Frosting:

Mix 1 (3 oz.) instant butter pecan pudding & 1 c. milk together & add 1 (8 oz.) Cool Whip. Frost cake when cooled & refrigerate.
