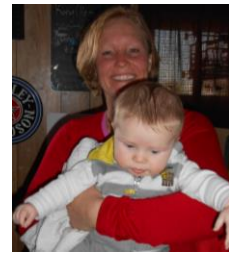

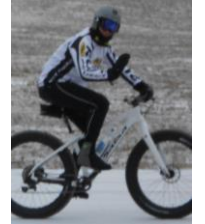
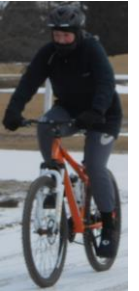

Chilling out on the "Do Not Freeze" Ride



Despite the unexpected snow that delayed the start of the ride, 31 cyclists participated in the annual DNF Ride hosted by Bike Central. Cyclists started at 9:20 a.m. and the first riders rolled into town about 10:20.

Kevin Richards, owner of Bike Central, said, "When the snow started at 8:30, I thought, "This isn't good." But he found the event brought a good turnout.

Bike Central employee Mark Strub said the roads in open areas weren't bad but the roads in Le Mars were slick. He wiped out in Le Mars but that didn't stop him. In fact, rain, snow or shine, bikers were set on coming to Brunsville. "People want a reason to get outdoors," Strub said.

Two routes to the Corner Café began and ended at Bike Central in Le Mars—one included K42 and the other included Jet Road (aravell).



Along with Le Mars, riders came from places including Yankton, Des Moines and Minnesota. One of the riders, Andre Skob, is originally from Denmark. He's lived in the U.S. since August of 1998 and is a project engineer for Wells. "I ride quite often," he says. The week before he'd participated in a fat bike ride in Minneapolis.

Cyclists had only positive comments about the ride.

"It was a good ride to end a stressful week," said Curt Driggs, an avid cyclist.

"My toes are cold but still attached," Lyle Stinton said. The DNF Ride was Stinton's first ride—ever. He's glad he participated because it was fun and exciting. He plans on coming back next year.

Jeff Mertes rode in the annual BRR Ride of Perry, Iowa in early February. When asked if the BRR Ride or the DNF Ride was easier, he replied, "There was a pretty good head wind coming into Brunsville."

Kona Brent, the event's youngest rider at only four months old, didn't have much to say about the ride. His mom, Theresa, said he slept the entire way in a trailer pulled behind the bike of his dad, Monte.

"I would like this event to grow every year," Richards said. His goal is for 60-70 people to attend. "The event is kind of like a homecoming or reunion; you see some of the people only once or twice a year."

Richards and Strub credit Andrea Raasch, co-owner of the Corner Café, for being so accommodating. "We certainly appreciate them being open when they normally aren't at this time," Strub said.

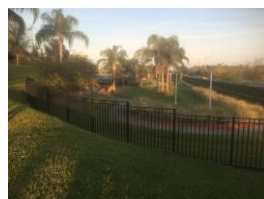

Asher Durand's "Summer Afternoon"

Artistic talent and lineage highlighted during next genealogy meeting

The Northwest Iowa Genealogical Society will hold their monthly meeting Sat., March 21 at the Le Mars Public Library at 1:30 P.M.

Harry Gray will be providing the program about his lineage to Asher Durand who was a member of the Hudson River School, which was the first true artistic fraternity. Harry has shared his artistic talent on many projects in Le Mars.

This 12th issuance in the **American Treasures** series features details of paintings by four renowned Hudson River School artists. The painting on the stamp is *Summer Afternoon* (1865) by Asher B. Durand, from the collection of the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

The Durands were members of the Huguenots, which were the French Protestants who were under oppression in the 1600's. As an ancestor of these artistic men, Harry will be showing examples of his art work at the meeting along with his lineage to the elder Durands. The program & meeting are free and open to the public.
